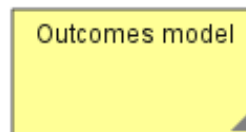

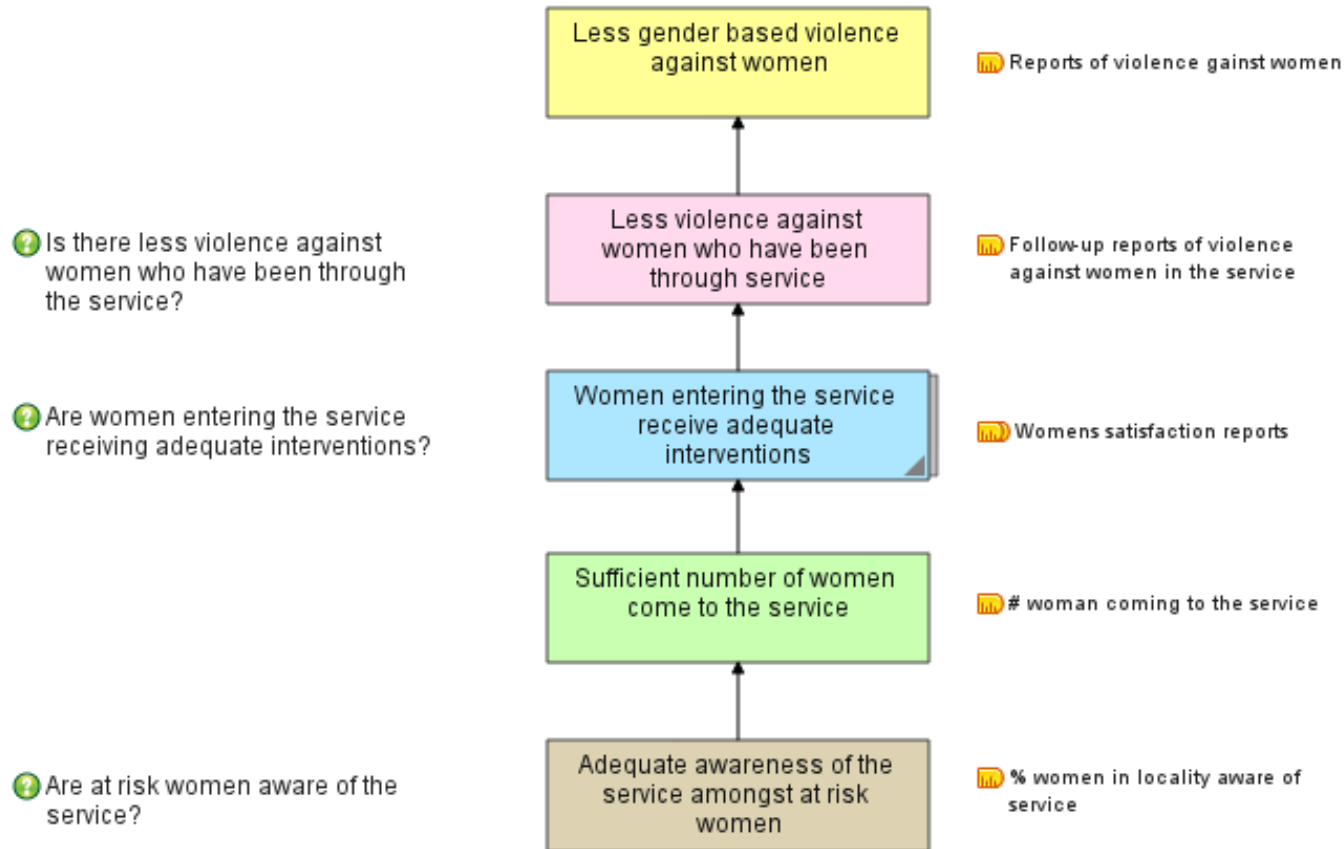

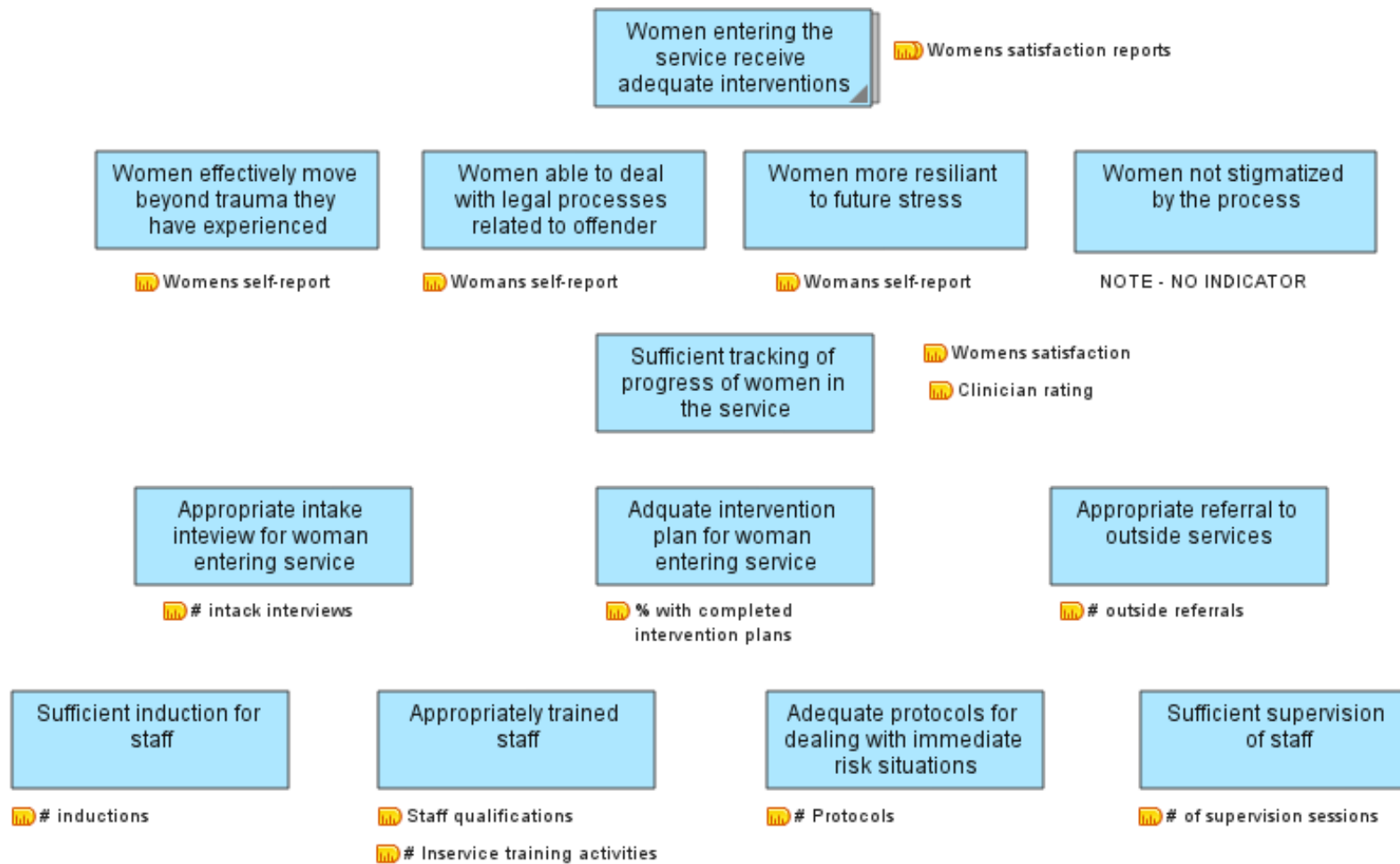

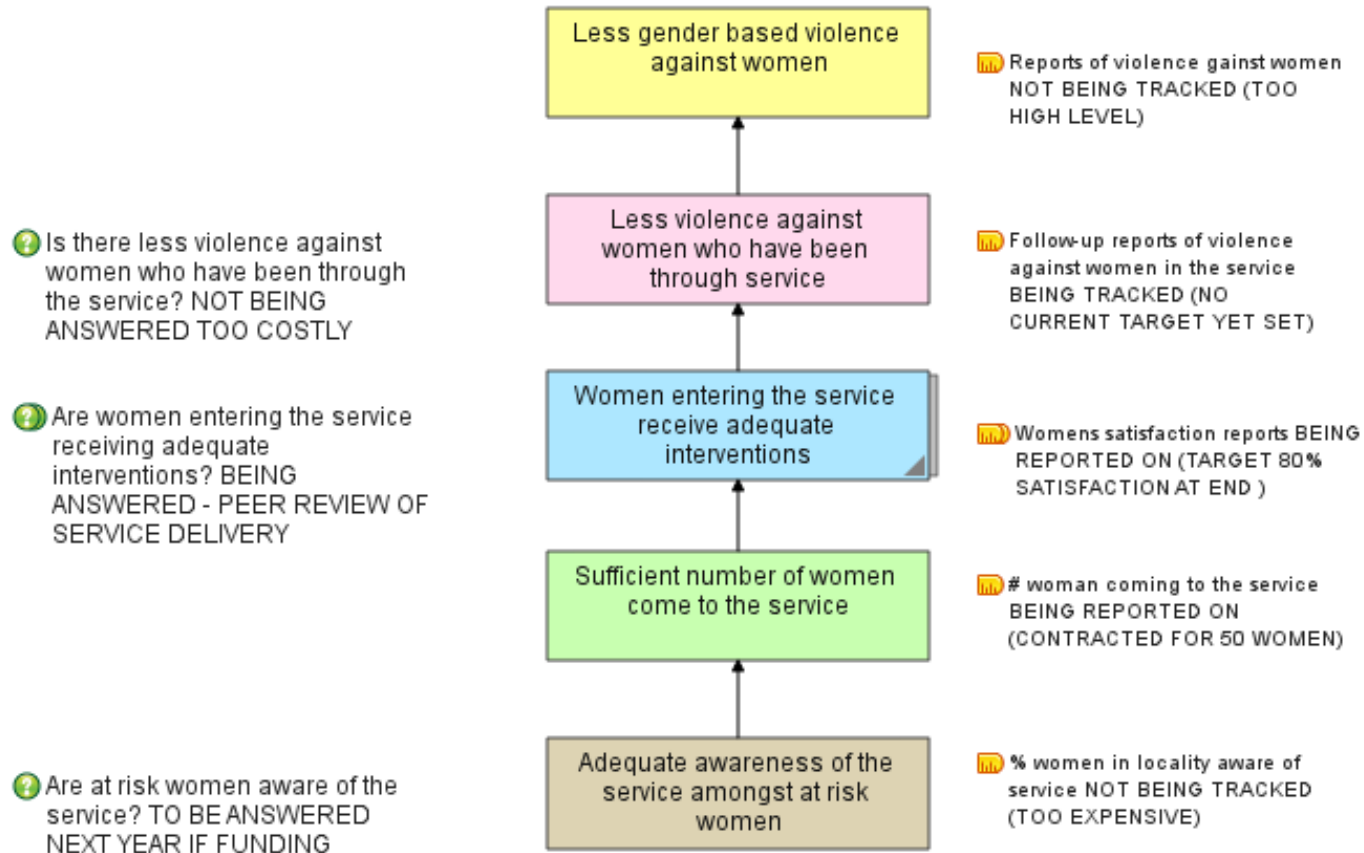
Part of an outcomes model for a Gender Based Violence Against Women program (illustrative only)

Notes on model

This model was produced to illustrate points about indicators, targets and contracting. The blog post from Dr Paul Duignans OutcomesBlog.org can be found at the link below.

The first version of the model (page) sets out the outcomes model drawing to the Easy Outcomes standards and includes possible indicators and evaluation questions. The second version of the model shows which indicators are going to be measured, which are contracted for, which have targets associated with them and which evaluation questions are going to be answered.

This approach allows outcomes to be identified - even those for which there are no indicators and it allows funders and providers to have a rich discussion regarding what can, and should be monitored and evaluated.
